## CHARGE I: VIOLATION OF 10 U.S.C. § 950b(28), CONSPIRACY

<u>Specification</u>: In that from on or about 21 December 2001 to on or about 31 January 2003, in and around Afghanistan, ABDUL GHANI, a person subject to trial by military commission as an alien unlawful enemy combatant, did conspire and agree with Skandar Shaw and Mohammed Hashim, and various other known and unknown persons, to commit offenses triable by military commission, including attempted murder in violation of the Law of War, destruction of property in violation of the Law of War, terrorism, and providing material support for terrorism knowing the unlawful purpose of the agreement and joined willfully with the intent to further the unlawful purpose, and did knowingly commit an overt act to effect the object of the conspiracy including, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. In or about 2002, ABDUL GHANI helped to transport land mines and other explosives devices on one or more occasions for use against U.S. and coalition forces;
- 2. In or about 2002, ABDUL GHANI helped to plant land mines and other explosive devices on one or more occasions for use against U.S. and coalition forces;
- 3. In the winter of 2001 or spring of 2002, while aided by Mohammed Hashim, ABDUL GHANI fired rockets at U.S. forces and bases;
- 4. In or about the fall of 2002, while aided by Skandar Shaw, ABDUL GHANI fired rockets at U.S. forces and bases;
- 5. In or about 2002, ABDUL GHANI accepted monetary payments, including payments from al Qaeda and others known and unknown, to commit attacks on U.S. forces and bases;
- 6. In or about the summer of 2002, while transporting mines and other explosives for use against U.S. and coalition forces, ABDUL GHANI participated in an attack on Afghan soldiers with small arms fire, in which one Afghan soldier was wounded;
- 7. In or about the summer of 2002, while transporting mines and other explosives for use against U.S. and coalition forces, ABDUL GHANI shot an Afghan soldier, causing serious wounds.

## CHARGE II: VIOLATION OF 10 U.S.C. § 950v(b)(25), PROVIDING MATERIAL SUPPORT FOR TERRORISM

<u>Specification</u>: In that from on or about 21 December 2001 to on or about 31 January 2003, in the context of and associated with an armed conflict, at or near Kandahar Air Base Afghanistan, ABDUL GHANI, a person subject to trial by military commission as an alien unlawful enemy combatant, did knowingly and intentionally provide material support and resources to be used for and in preparation of terrorist acts by, among other things:

- 1. Making himself available to carry out acts of terrorism;
- 2. Transporting mines and other explosives for use against U.S and coalition forces and allies;
- 3. Transporting and providing rockets for use against U.S and coalition forces and allies;
- 4. Providing expert advice and assistance in the use of rockets, mines and other explosives for use against U.S. and coalition forces and allies.

## CHARGE III: VIOLATION OF 10 U.S.C. §950t, ATTEMPTED MURDER IN VIOLATION OF THE LAW OF WAR

<u>Specification 1</u>: In that no earlier than the winter of 2001 but no later than the summer of 2002, at or near Kandahar Air Base, Afghanistan, in the context of and associated with an armed conflict, ABDUL GHANI, an alien unlawful enemy combatant subject to trial by military commission, did knowingly, intentionally and unlawfully attempt to commit murder in violation of the Law of War by firing rockets at U.S. bases with the intent to kill U.S. and coalition forces; said acts were done with the specific intent to commit a certain offense under the Military Commissions Act, to wit: murder in violation of the Law of War; and said acts amounted to more than mere preparation and apparently tended to effect the commission of the intended offense.

<u>Specification 2</u>: In that in or about the fall of 2002, at or near Kandahar Air Base, Afghanistan, in the context of and associated with an armed conflict, ABDUL GHANI, an alien unlawful enemy combatant subject to trial by military commission, did knowingly, intentionally and unlawfully attempt to commit murder in violation of the Law of War by firing rockets at U.S. bases with the intent to kill U.S. and coalition forces; said acts were done with the specific intent to commit a certain offense under the Military Commissions Act, to wit: murder in violation of the Law of War; and the acts amounted to more than mere preparation and apparently tended to effect the commission of the intended offense. <u>Specification 3</u>: In that in or about the summer of 2002, at or near Kandahar Air Base, Afghanistan, in the context of and associated with an armed conflict, ABDUL GHANI, an alien unlawful enemy combatant subject to trial by military commission, did knowingly, intentionally and unlawfully attempt to commit murder in violation of the Law of War by shooting with a firearm Commander Nayamet-U-Allh of the Afghan military forces; said act was done with the specific intent to commit a certain offense under the Military Commissions Act, to wit: murder in violation of the Law of War; and the act amounted to more than mere preparation and apparently tended to effect the commission of the intended offense.

<u>Specification 4</u>: In that between 1 January 2002 and 31 January 2003, in Kandahar, Afghanistan, in the context of and associated with an armed conflict, ABDUL GHANI, an alien unlawful enemy combatant subject to trial by military commission, did knowingly, intentionally and unlawfully attempt to commit murder in violation of the Law of War by planting landmines and improvised explosive devices in the ground with the intent to kill U.S. and coalition forces; said acts were done with the specific intent to commit a certain offense under the Military Commissions Act, to wit: murder in violation of the Law of War; and the acts amounted to more than mere preparation and apparently tended to effect the commission of the intended offense.
