- 1 [The R.M.C. 803 session was called to order at 1037,
- 2 22 October 2015.]
- **3** MJ [COL POHL]: The commission is called to order. All
- 4 parties are again present when the commission recessed.
- 5 Mr. Harrington, what is your defense team's position
- 6 on the MOU, please?
- 7 LDC [MR. HARRINGTON]: Judge, at this time we are going to
- 8 sign the MOUs and file reservations to it.
- 9 MJ [COL POHL]: Do you intend to file the other piece of
- **10** paper that ----
- 11 LDC [MR. HARRINGTON]: Yes.
- 12 MJ [COL POHL]: Okay. And I understand that there is some
- **13** issue about printing the MOU itself?
- **14** LDC [MR. HARRINGTON]: Right.
- 15 MJ [COL POHL]: So that issue now is resolved.
- **16** LDC [MR. HARRINGTON]: Correct.
- 17 MJ [COL POHL]: Trial Counsel, how long will it take to
- 18 read on Mr. Harrington's team for the program?
- 19 CP [BG MARTINS]: Your Honor, we are setting up that
- 20 read-on right now, and we have -- we conferred with Mr. Ruiz's
- 21 team. We are seeking to ensure that the folks that he
- 22 believes he needs in this today are read on too.
- MJ [COL POHL]: So once the read-on is done, then the next

- **1** issue would be to schedule the 505(h) hearing?
- **2** CP [BG MARTINS]: Yes, Your Honor.
- **3** MJ [COL POHL]: Okay.
- 4 CP [BG MARTINS]: I think we could ----
- 5 MJ [COL POHL]: We are doing it today. I'm not thinking
- **6** of tomorrow. We can do -- I am thinking of an hourly time.
- 7 CP [BG MARTINS]: Aim for 1300, perhaps?
- 8 MJ [COL POHL]: Okay. Here is the way -- here is going to
- **9** be the way ahead. The detainees will be returned to the camp
- 10 or left in the holding cell, that's a decision that seems to
- 11 me is -- we will set the 505(h) hearing for 1330 with the
- 12 understanding that, if necessary, we will follow that up today
- 13 with the R.M.C. 806 closed session, okay? I understand there
- 14 are rulings that have got to be made. And then we will pick
- 15 up tomorrow.
- So what I am saying is the detainees' presence will
- 17 not be required until tomorrow, and I will go over that
- 18 schedule in a second.
- 19 Mr. Ruiz?
- 20 LDC [MR. RUIZ]: Judge, as always, I just want to make
- 21 sure my position is clear. We are conferring with government
- 22 counsel on having our DSO read on; at a minimum we think he is
- 23 necessary. However, our position is still that every defense

- 1 team member on Mr. al Hawsawi's team requires that. We are
- 2 not working that angle now, only the DSO, but that's not to
- 3 say that we are taking the position that that's what's
- 4 required.
- 5 MJ [COL POHL]: Okay. Got it. Got it. I got it. It's
- 6 all -- for the defense teams that are not being read on, if
- 7 you have an objection to that procedure, it's preserved and we
- 8 will litigate it at the appropriate time.
- 9 Mr. Nevin.
- 10 LDC [MR. NEVIN]: Your Honor, may Mr. Mohammad remain here
- **11** with us until 1300 or until ----
- **12** MJ [COL POHL]: No
- 13 LDC [MR. NEVIN]: Did you say 1330?
- 14 MJ [COL POHL]: I said we are going to go at 1330. The
- 15 problem is that to conduct the hearing, the place has got to
- 16 be cleared out.
- **17** LDC [MR. NEVIN]: I understand.
- 18 MJ [COL POHL]: And we are going to do that at 1330. The
- 19 detainees, at a minimum, have to be out of the courtroom not
- **20** later than 1230.
- **21** LDC [MR. NEVIN]: 1230. Okay.
- 22 MJ [COL POHL]: Okay. If they want to keep them in the
- 23 trailers to pray and then go back, that's up to them.

- 1 LDC [MR. NEVIN]: We can remain here until 1230, then?
- **2** MJ [COL POHL]: 1230.
- 3 Ms. Bormann.
- 4 LDC [MS. BORMANN]: Just briefly, before we start the 505
- 5 hearing, I assume General Baker will be read on and then we
- 6 can provide him the document I attempted to discuss with him
- 7 yesterday, then I need time to talk with General Baker before
- 8 we start the 505 hearing because it affects our position going
- **9** forward.
- 10 MJ [COL POHL]: We start the 505 hearing at 1330. If that
- 11 issue needs to be resolved, and it can't be resolved before
- 12 then, we will get to it, but since we are going to have an
- 13 opportunity to read on Mr. Harrington's team, I suspect
- 14 General Baker will have time to do it. But I am not delaying
- 15 this thing incessantly on what I consider -- we just need to
- **16** move it along.
- 17 LDC [MS. BORMANN]: Sure. I just want to let you know I
- 18 am going to try to make that happen.
- 19 MJ [COL POHL]: Just so everybody understands the way
- 20 ahead tomorrow, assuming -- well, not assuming. The first
- 21 issue will be 380, okay, and the next issue after that, with
- 22 the abundance of optimism that I have, we will switch up and
- 23 pick up 292, so notify the SRT. Then we will go back with

- **1** with the regular prosecution team, since 013 is resolved. We
- 2 will then -- I believe 350 was next on the agenda, and then
- 3 254. Just kind of the way ahead.
- 4 Did I miss something, Mr. Trivett? You are nodding
- 5 your head.
- 6 MDTC [MR. TRIVETT]: I believe 152 was next, sir.
- 7 MJ [COL POHL]: Yes, 152.
- 8 MDTC [MR. TRIVETT]: Can we get a quick point of
- 9 clarification, sir? The 505(h) is specific only to 380 and
- 10 not other issues as well, correct?
- 11 MJ [COL POHL]: Yes. I know there are other motions, but
- 12 we are talking about 380 and 380 only this afternoon, okay?
- 13 So that will be the way ahead and then -- now tomorrow,
- 14 Ms. Bormann, because the issue deals with your client's
- 15 specific issues, he has to be here tomorrow. If he chooses
- 16 not to be here tomorrow, then I am going to consider that a
- 17 current -- the current status is he does not wish to raise the
- 18 issue at this time and we are going to go forward as we have
- 19 been with you as his counsel. If he is here tomorrow, we can
- 20 discuss the pro se issues with him.
- 21 And that goes for all the other accused, obviously.
- 22 It's their choice whether they wish to be here tomorrow or
- 23 not. But if they are not here tomorrow, particularly

| 5  | LDC [MS. BORMANN]: No, Judge, on that issue, but               |
| 6  | Mr. Bin'Attash so tomorrow is a holy day, and                  |
| 7  | Mr. Bin'Attash is asking whether or not you would address his  |
| 8  | issue on Monday, and we could go ahead on 292 and then sort of |
| 9  | take things out of order.                                      |
| 0  | MJ [COL POHL]: If he wishes okay. First of all, just           |
| 1  | to review the bidding, what I have before me on 380 is a       |
| 2  | request to advise an accused of his pro se rights, not a       |
| 3  | request from the accused to go pro se. So if Mr. Bin'Attash    |
| 4  | wishes to raise not raise that issue tomorrow and do it on     |
| 5  | Monday, he absolutely can. Okay?                               |
| 6  | LDC [MS. BORMANN]: Thank you. That's clear. Thank you.         |
| 7  | MJ [COL POHL]: Okay. The commission is in recess until         |
| 8  | the 1330 505(h) hearing.                                       |
