

Colonel Martin T. Mitchell, U.S. Air Force

Colonel Mitchell began his duties on the U.S. Court of Military Commission Review on October 28, 2014, as an Associate Appellate Judge. On October 20, 2014, Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel appointed him to the U. S. Court of Military Commission Review. He has served as an Appellate Military Judge on the U.S. Air Force Court of Criminal Appeals since June 2013.

Colonel Mitchell has been an active duty Air Force judge advocate since 1996. He began his career as a judge advocate stationed at McChord AFB, WA, and afterward transitioned over to serve as the Area Defense Counsel. He next served as a Circuit Defense Counsel at Maxwell AFB, AL, and then was selected to attend Georgetown University where he earned his LL.M., with distinction. Upon completion of his LL.M., Colonel Mitchell served in several specialized positions in Rosslyn, VA, including serving as a labor attorney, employment litigation attorney, and executive officer. In 2006, Colonel Mitchell returned to military justice and served as the Chief, Circuit Defense Counsel stationed at Randolph AFB, TX. He then served as a Staff Judge Advocate at the 67th Network Warfare Wing at Lackland AFB, TX, and the 6th Air Mobility Wing at MacDill AFB, FL, before becoming a military trial judge at McChord Field, WA

Colonel Mitchell obtained his Juris Doctorate and Masters of Laws (LL.M) degrees from Georgetown University School of Law and his undergraduate degree from the University of Delaware.
