During the most recent departure by Al Bayoumi, he was gone for up to five months before returning to his family at Parkwood. Ratchford was unsure where Al Bayoumi went when he would leave for months at a time. Al Bayoumi and his family owed money when they departed in June 2001, and his rental file has been forwarded to Resident Group Services, 1156 Grove, Anaheim, California, telephone 714630-5300, a collection company.

Al Bayoumi spent much time either at or with members of the Islamic Center of San Diego, 7050 Eckstrom Ave, San Diego, California 92111. Ratchford provided a copy of a check that Al Bayoumi's wife had written to Parkwood Apartment Homes. Bank of America Check Number 439, account number 12200066104391747500308, was written to Parkwood Apartments in the amount of \$791.96. The name on the check was Manal A. Bagader, 6602 Beadnell Way, #6, San Diego, California 92111, telephone 619277-5941.

Al Bayoumi had received reference fees for two or three other renters at Parkwood Apartment Homes. The names of those individual renters should be located in the rental file located at Resident Group Services. All of those renters have left Parkwood Apartment Homes. Ratchford provided that one of those renters referenced by Al Bayoumi had left on September 4, 2001. Gross provided that Al Hazimi and Al Mihdhar's rental file would be located in their main office in Irvine, California.

A former assistant at Parkwood Apartment Homes, Nicole Sabala, who is currently employed at Padre Gardens, 10343 San Diego Mission Road, San Diego, California, telephone 619563-1856, would have known Al Bayoumi and his associates during her tenure at

Parkwood Apartment Homes management records system was negative for Hani Hanjoor, date of birth DOB August 30, 1972.

Five or six current residents of Parkwood Apartment Homes may be members of the Islamic Center of San Diego.

On or about February 5, 2000, Khalid M. Al-Mihdhar and his roommate Nawaf M. Al-Hazmi moved into the Parkwood Apartments at 6401 Mount Ada, Apartment 150, San Diego, California. According to the rental applications, Al-Mihdhar and Al-Hazmi were residing at Omar A. Al-Bayoumi's residence at the same apartment complex located at 6333 Mount Ada, Apartment 152. Prior to residing at Al-Bayoumi's residence, Al-Mihdhar and Al-Hazmi wrote that they were from Saudi Arabia. Al-Bayoumi co-signed for Al-Mihdhar and Al-Hazmi and no employment was noted on either application.

Al-Mihdhar's B1/B2 Visa 19990979050005 showed that it was issued on April 7, 1999 in Jeddah and expired on April 6, 2000. Al-Mihdhar's date of birth (DOB) is May 16, 1975 and Passport Number is B721156. Al-Hazmi's B1/B2 Visa 19990938250002 showed that it was issued on April 3, 1999 in Jeddah and expired on April 2, 2000. Al-Hazmi's date of birth (DOB) August 9, 1976 and Passport Number is B673987.

The term of the lease was for four months and showed Al-Bayoumi as the Guarantor and Co-Signer, who made some payments on Apartment 150. A copy of Bank of America, Transaction Record, Account 09000-05839 showed a deposit of \$9,900.00 into an unknown checking account on February 4, 2000.

The following address and telephone number was written down for unknown reasons, 8451 Mount Vernon, Lemon Grove, California 91945, (619) 697-8808.

On February 13, 2000, a handwritten 30 day Intent to Vacate Notice was signed by Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar to vacate on March 13, 2000, however it was rescinded and they moved out on May 31, 2000 with a refund in the amount of \$638.14 owed to them. They left no forwarding address.

On September 28, 2001, Adel M. Rafeea was interviewed at the San Diego office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation by Special Agents (SAs) Suzanne Hesselman and R. Joseph Shultz. Rafeea was accompanied by his attorney, Randall B. Hamud. After being advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and the purpose of the interview, Rafeea provided the following information:

During the period of Ramadan which took place in December 1999 or January 2000, Rafeea became familiar with an individual known to him as "Osama". Osama was a Caucasian male who had converted to Islam and began attending services at the Islamic Center of San Diego (ICSD). Rafeea advised Ramadan lasts approximately one month and that Osama attended ceremonies at the ICSD during that time. Rafeea does not know Osama's last name but recalled he was married to a Hispanic woman who he fought with often. Osama drove a grey Mitsubishi sport utility vehicle. He stopped coming to the ICSD after Ramadan however, his wife continued to come for a few months. Rafeea recalled Osama's wife appeared pregnant during the time she came to the ICSD without Osama and that he had seen her with an African-American female on at least one occasion.

Rafeea does not know where Osama worked however, he did recall Osama showing him a certificate from the U.S. Coast Guard notifying Osama he had passed his tests and was accepted into the Coast Guard. Osama never mentioned any employment other than the Coast Guard.

Rafeea recalled Osama attended a party at the residence of Nawaf Alhazmi and Khalid Al-Mihdar. Osama filmed the party with Albayoumi's videotape recorder. Osama was friendly with Omar Albayoumi and Rafeea saw them together often.

Osama never mentioned anything about his family. Rafeea could not recall any other friends Osama had nor could he identify anyone who could provide additional information concerning Osama.

Rafeea was shown a San Diego Police Department Booking photograph of Nawaf Alharbi, date of birth June 20, 1977. Rafeea reported he was unfamiliar with the individual depicted in the photograph.

Rafeea described Osama as a white male in his late twenties approximately five feet five or six inches tall with dark hair and dark eyes. He had a thin build and was growing a beard on his chin. Osama's wife was described as being Hispanic, approximately five feet five inches tall in her mid twenties. She has a chubby build and a round face.

01/15/1969, of 6699 Beadnell Way, Apt. 203, San Diego, California, home telephone number (858)571-6226 was interviewed at the San Diego Office of the FBI. RAFEEA was accompanied by RANDALL B. HAMUD, Attorney at law, who represents the Islamic Center of San Diego. After being advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and the purpose of the interview, he provided the following information:

RAFEEA was shown two photographs from the International Combat Information Center Watch Officer Expeditionary Warfare Training Group, Pacific Class 00-1 and asked to identify a Saudi Arabian naval officer depicted in each photograph. RAFEEA recognized the officer as visitor to the Islamic Center of San Diego. RAFEEA remembered the officer identified himself as a naval officer but did not recall his name. RAFEEA was told the name of the officer was NAWAF AL HARBI and asked if it was the same NAWAF Al Harbi who asked him to receive a wire transfer of funds. RAFEEA stated the NAWAF AL HARBI who asked him to receive a wire transfer was not the naval officer in the pictures displayed before him.

RAFEEA was shown the California Department of Motor Vehicles photograph belonging to OMAR AHMED AL-BAYOUMI. RAFEEA identified the photograph as belonging to AL-BAYOUMI. AL-BAYOUMI lived in the same complex as NAWAF M. S. ALHAZMI and KHALID M. A. ALMIHDAR. RAFEEA had known Al-Bayoumi since 1997. RAFEEA thought AL-BAYOUMI was living in the United States prior to 1997. AL-BAYOUMI was studying International Business at U.S. International University (USIU) in San Diego. RAFEEA was introduced to AL-BAYOUMI at USIU when they both were administered the TOEFEL English proficiency examination.

AL-BAYOUMI was a very social person. AL-BAYOUMI attended prayers regularly at the Islamic Center of San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI often brought copies of the Koran provided by the Saudi Arabian Consulate to pass out at the Islamic Center. AL-BAYOUMI may have assisted others with locating lodging in the San Diego area. AL-BAYOUMI was married with four children: two boys and two girls.

AL-BAYOUMI left the United States for the United Kingdom around July 2001. AL-BAYOUMI first left for the United Kingdom in June 2001 then traveled to Saudi Arabia. RAFEEA learned of AL-BAYOUMI's travel from his family who remained in San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI returned to San Diego for approximately one month before leaving with his family to the United Kingdom in July 2001. AL-BAYOUMI told RAFEEA he was the President of the Saudi Student Club in Birmingham, United Kingdom.

AL-BAYOUMI tended to associate with the Saudi Arabian and Persian Gulf students who attended the Islamic Center of San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI did not travel to any particular destination when he lived in San Diego. Al-BAYOUMI appeared to have regular contact with the Saudi Arabian consulate in Los Angeles, California. AL-BAYOUMI made frequent trips to the consulate during the six years he was known to have lived in San Diego.

Approximately one year ago, AL-BAYOUMI told RAFEEA he had obtained a work permit from a local company and did not have to have the prerequisite twelve units of classes required for persons with a student visa. Al-BAYOUMI never said which company had hired him or what type of work he was to accomplish.

NAWAF ALHAZMI and KHALID ALMIHDAR told RAFEEA they were taking English lessons at a local college located near the intersection of Genesee Avenue and Clairmont Mesa Boulevard in San Diego.

The Islamic Center of San Diego has a soccer team which meets every Saturday. KHALID ALMIHDAR and NAWAF ALHAZMI both played with the soccer team. All soccer meetings were held at the park adjacent to the Islamic Center. The soccer field was reserved for use through the San Diego Parks division. Each mosque within San Diego County has a soccer team and regular tournaments were played with them. The two coaches of the team were SAMIR NUHAILY and MUHIDIN DEAN NUHAILY. Both are brothers and part of the Islamic Center's sports committee.

RAFEEA was shown a photograph of HANI HANJOOR. RAFEEA said he did not recognize the person in the photograph nor the name HANI HANJOOR.

RAFEEA was shown a photograph of OMAR BAKARBASHAT. RAFEEA identified the person in the photograph as OMAR. RAFEEA did not know OMAR's last name. OMAR was from Yemen and had a

OMAR came to the Islamic Center on a regular basis and looked through ads for a roommate. OMAR appeared to be homeless for some time. As of three weeks ago, OMAR was still looking for an apartment. OMAR was always looking for work. RAFEEA did see OMAR working at a hand car wash in La Mesa, California, near the I-8 and the Rte 125 interchange. OMAR had a Suzuki jeep which he placed a for sale ad at the Islamic Center. RAFEEA was shown a photograph of HASHIM ALATTAS. RAFEEA recognized ALATTAS but did not know his name. ALATTAS came to the Islamic Center only on one occasion at the beginning of summer 2001 with an unidentified male. ALATTAS was smiling and friendly and said he was from Saudi Arabia or Yemen. Both ALATTAS and the unidentified male were not frequent visitors to the Islamic Center.

OMAR AHMED MUSTAFA AL-BAYOUMI, date of birth 11/29/1957, Saudi passport #B758501, was interviewed in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. Present during both interview sessions was Present during the first interview session was FB

Special Agent Ammar Y. Barghouty in case Arabic translation was necessary; however, both interview sessions were conducted entirely in English. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing agents and the nature of the interview, AL-BAYOUMI provided the following information.

AL-BAYOUMI has worked for the Saudi Arabian Presidency of Civil Aviation (PCA) for approximately twenty-seven years, and currently works in the finance/budget department. AL-BAYOUMI was sent to the United States in approximately 1995 to study English and to obtain advanced educational degrees. AL-BAYOUMI explained that this undertaking was part of a program aimed to educate Saudi Arabian citizens abroad and to have them retain their employment upon return to Saudi Arabia. Before traveling to the United States, AL-BAYOUMI was transferred to Dallah Avco, a subcontractor of the PCA, through which he was to receive both a salary and a stipend to cover tuition fees, housing, and other living expenses. During his time in the United States, AL-BAYOUMI received both a salary as well as an additional stipend. While later attending school in the United Kingdom, AL-BAYOUMI continued to receive funding for his tuition.

Depending on the budgetary situation, AL-BAYOUMI was sometimes told that funding for his tuition and/or living expenses were to be drawn directly from his salary. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the specific dates or periods of time during which he was told to pay for his tuition or housing from his salary. At other times, AL-BAYOUMI received additional funds, separate from his salary, to pay for his tuition and/or housing. During these periods of time, his additional stipend would be increased. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the specific dates or periods of time during which he received an increased stipend.

AL-BAYOUMI identified the name HAMID AL-RASHID as an official of PCA, but advised that AL-RASHID was not his supervisor. AL-BAYOUMI does not personally know AL-RASHID. AL-BAYOUMI did not recognize the name or photograph of SAUD AL-RASHEED [Note: This

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

black and white photograph of SAUD AL-RASHEED, dressed in traditional Saudi Arabian attire, was obtained from an image of his Saudi Arabian passport. A copy of the photograph of SAUD AL-RASHEED is attached to and made part of this FD-302. A copy of this photograph is also enclosed in a FD-340 within the case file].

While living in San Diego, Al-BAYOUMI was contacted by SAAD AL-HABIB, a Saudi individual who had attended school in San Diego, regarding the mosque used by the Kurdish population in San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the date that he was contacted by AL-HABIB. AL-HABIB informed AL-BAYOUMI that he was interested in funding a new mosque for the Kurdish community because the mosque was located in a small building without a parking lot. AL-HABIB asked AL-BAYOUMI to assist in acquiring a larger building to house the mosque, to which AL-BAYOUMI agreed. AL-BAYOUMI subsequently looked for and obtained a building in El Cajon, California, that included a parking lot. Al-HABIB provided all of the money to AL-BAYOUMI to purchase the building, to include the 10,000 USD for which AL-BAYOUMI then wrote a check for the initial down payment. AL-BAYOUMI became the facility supervisor of the mosque, named the Al Medina Al-Munarawah Mosque, on a volunteer basis and kept an office in the mosque. AL-BAYOUMI was not paid for his position at the mosque.

AL-BAYOUMI was not employed in San Diego other than his volunteer position at the mosque. While in San Diego, AL-BAYOUMI had last attended Keller Graduate School where he took courses in the Certified Public Accountant (CPA) program. AL-BAYOUMI did not finish the CPA program because he did not like the field of accounting. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the exact dates of his attendance at Keller Graduate School.

In early 2000, AL-BAYOUMI and ISAMU (LNU) traveled from San Diego to Los Angeles in order for AL-BAYOUMI to submit passport applications for himself and his family to the Saudi Arabian Consulate in Los Angeles. ISAMU was described as a white American convert to Islam who was approximately twenty-two years old [Note: this individual is known to investigators to be ISAMU DYSON]. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the exact date of this trip to Los Angeles, but recalled that it was in the beginning of 2000. AL-BAYOUMI had called the Consulate prior to traveling to Los Angeles and was told that each applicant needed to submit three photographs. Because AL-BAYOUMI only had two photographs of himself, he and ISAMU stopped on the way to Los Angeles in order for AL-BAYOUMI to obtain another photograph. ISAMU directed AL-BAYOUMI to a location where

ISAMU knew they would be able to obtain a photograph. AL-BAYOUMI had his picture taken in a photo booth, and they proceeded to the Saudi Arabian Consulate. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the location at which he had his picture taken.

AL-BAYOUMI and ISAMU entered the Consulate and AL-BAYOUMI submitted the passport applications to a female employee. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the name of this employee. AL-BAYOUMI was informed that the applications would be processed and the passports mailed to him within two to three days. While at the Consulate, AL-BAYOUMI also picked up Islamic books and children's books from the Islamic Affairs section to bring back to the mosque in San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI visited the Consulate approximately once or twice per year to pick up books. AL-BAYOUMI usually had contact with SAAD JEBREEN [phonetic] in the Islamic Affairs section of the Consulate, but AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the name of the person from whom he obtained the books on that day. AL-BAYOUMI described this person as a tall individual, heavier than AL-BAYOUMI, with a long black/gray beard and not from Saudi Arabia.

After leaving the Consulate, AL-BAYOUMI and ISAMU continued on to a halal restaurant at which AL-BAYOUMI had previously eaten with his family. After discovering that the restaurant was "closed down", AL-BAYOUMI and ISAMU went to another nearby halal restaurant where they ate lunch. While walking out of the restaurant, AL-BAYOUMI overheard two males speaking Arabic. Thinking that they sounded from the Gulf region, AL-BAYOUMI introduced himself and asked the two males where they were from. The two males introduced themselves as KHALID and NAWAF, and stated that they were from Saudi Arabia [Note: these two individuals are known to investigators to be KHALID AL-MIHDHAR and NAWAF AL-HAZMI] They informed AL-BAYOUMI that they had arrived in the United States approximately one month prior to study English. Neither KHALID nor NAWAF mentioned where they were residing in Los Angeles, but they may have spoke about plans to travel to San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI told them that he lived near the mosque in San Diego, and that they could contact him if ever in San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall if he provided his telephone number. The conversation lasted for approximately five minutes.


Before meeting them in the restaurant, AL-BAYOUMI had never seen nor heard of KHALID AL-MIHDHAR and/or NAWAF AL-HAZMI. AL-BAYOUMI was not introduced to KHALID and NAWAF by any other individual, rather he just happened to meet them in the restaurant. AL-BAYOUMI was not instructed to visit that specific restaurant on

that day, nor was he instructed to meet KHALID and NAWAF in Los Angeles.

After leaving the restaurant, AL-BAYOUMI and ISAMU spoke of visiting the King Fahad Mosque in Culver City because ISAMU was eager to see the building. AL-BAYOUMI, however, could not recall how to get to the mosque and they instead proceeded directly back to San Diego. Previously, AL-BAYOUMI had visited the King Fahad Mosque once or twice per year. On one of these occasions, AL-BAYOUMI visited the King Fahad Mosque with his eldest son EMAD and DR. ABDUSATTAR SHEIKH.

AL-BAYOUMI identified the name and photograph of FAHAD AL-THUMAIRY as an Imam at the King Fahad Mosque, but denied knowing that AL-THUMAIRY was employed at the Saudi Consulate in Los Angeles [Note: This black and white photograph of AL-THUMAIRY was obtained from his U.S. visa application. A copy of the photograph of AL-THUMAIRY is attached to and made part of this FD-302. A copy of this photograph is also enclosed in a FD-340 within the case file]. AL-BAYOUMI did not see nor talk to AL-THUMAIRY on the day that he and ISAMU traveled to the Consulate in Los Angeles. In addition to AL-THUMAIRY, a black African male was also an Imam at the King Fahad Mosque. AL-BAYOUMI did not recognize the name or photograph of MOHAMMED AL-MUHANNA [Note: This black and white photograph of AL-MUHANNA was obtained from his U.S. visa application. A copy of the photograph of AL-MUHANNA, dressed in traditional Saudi Arabian attire, is attached to and made part of this FD-302. A copy of this photograph is also enclosed in a FD-340 within the case file].

Less than one week after the trip to Los Angeles, KHALID and NAWAF arrived at the Islamic Center of San Diego (ICSD) and asked the Imam if OMAR was around. AL-BAYOUMI believed that ABDUL MAJID was the name of the Imam. The Imam responded that OMAR would be in later to pray. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall if he met KHALID and NAWAF at the mosque or at the apartment complex later that day, nor could he recall the exact date that KHALID and NAWAF arrived at the mosque. When they did meet, KHALID and NAWAF told AL-BAYOUMI that they were looking to rent an apartment in the area of the mosque.


AL-BAYOUMI accompanied KHALID and NAWAF to the management office of Parkwood Apartments, at which AL-BAYOUMI and his family were residing. AL-BAYOUMI assisted KHALID and NAWAF in filling out the apartment rental application, as their English skills were very poor. At the direction of the manager, AL-BAYOUMI listed his name

on the application and also the name of his friend LUWAM (LNU) as a reference. The manager instructed AL-BAYOUMI to list LUWAM as a reference because LUWAM had resided at Parkwood Apartments for an extended period of time. AL-BAYOUMI filled out the rental applications in the names of KHALID, NAWAF, and himself, and listed his own address as the previous residence of both KHALID and NAWAF even though they had never lived there. KHALID and NAWAF each signed their own signatures on the applications, and AL-BAYOUMI signed his own signature on the application and as guarantor.


AL-BAYOUMI identified his own handwriting and signature on copies of the three rental applications and the guarantee form [Note: these copies are enclosed in a FD-340 within the case file]. AL-BAYOUMI did not completely read the terms of agreement to signing as the guarantor, but did so to help out KHALID and NAWAF as newcomers to the community. AL-BAYOUMI advised that it was common practice in their community and in the mosque to assist individuals new to the area. When AL-BAYOUMI first moved to San Diego, an individual named (FNU) HAMMERMAN had assisted him in obtaining an apartment rental. AL-BAYOUMI therefore did the same for KHALID and NAWAF. Other than KHALID and NAWAF, AL-BAYOUMI did not recall assisting any other individuals in obtaining an apartment rental.

KHALID and NAWAF attempted to pay cash for their rent and security deposit, but the management office would not accept cash payment. After the manager advised that they needed to open a bank account, AL-BAYOUMI offered to assist them in doing so. AL-BAYOUMI therefore accompanied KHALID and NAWAF to a local branch of Bank of America at which AL-BAYOUMI had an existing account. KHALID and NAWAF opened a bank account with a large amount of cash. AL-BAYOUMI did not know the exact amount of cash that KHALID and NAWAF possessed, but believed it may have been between 4000 USD and 8000 USD

KHALID and NAWAF also needed to obtain a bank check to pay for their rent and security deposit at Parkwood Apartments, however, the bank teller informed them that they could not obtain a check as new customers who had no credit history. The teller suggested that they deposit cash into AL-BAYOUMI's existing account and draw the check upon AL-BAYOUMI's account. Upon obtaining the check from AL-BAYOUMI's account, KHALID and NAWAF immediately provided AL-BAYOUMI with the same amount of cash as the bank check and AL-BAYOUMI deposited the money into his account. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall if he accompanied KHALID and NAWAF back to the

manager's officer when they submitted the check.

AL-BAYOUMI never paid rent or otherwise provided money to either KHALID or NAWAF. KHALID and NAWAF did not stay at AL-BAYOUMI's apartment at any time. AL-BAYOUMI did not know if they stayed anywhere else in San Diego before moving into their own apartment. A Syrian individual named NEBNU [phonetic] (LNU) owned a recreational vehicle (RV) which he kept in the parking lot of the ICSD, but AL-BAYOUMI did not have knowledge of either KHALID or NAWAF ever staying in the RV. KHALID and NAWAF had met NEENU at the mosque. AL-BAYOUMI described NEENU as having some mental problems.

Approximately two to four days after KHALID and NAWAF moved into Parkwood Apartments, AL-BAYOUMI was planning a dinner in honor of a sheikh from Norway who had lectured and provided his services at the mosque during Ramadan. The sheikh was known by the Kurdish members of the mosque and visited the mosque for two consecutive years. AL-BAYOUMI planned on holding the dinner at the mosque, but others felt that the mosque was out of the way and people therefore would not attend. AL-BAYOUMI then decided to hold the dinner at Parkwood Apartments. Because the female guests would be in his own apartment with his wife, AL-BAYOUMI asked KHALID and NAWAF if the male guests could congregate in their apartment because there was empty space and no furniture in their apartment. KHALID and NAWAF agreed that the dinner could be held in their apartment.

During the dinner, KHALID and NAWAF stayed in the back room of their apartment despite being invited to sit with the other individuals in attendance. Although they stayed in the back room, KHALID and NAWAF did converse with other individuals who circulated throughout the apartment. An individual [NFI] who had led prayers at the mosque and who was returning home was presented with a plaque during the dinner. ISAMU was also presented with a plaque from AL-BAYOUMI's son in appreciation of ISAMU's assistance with his studies. The sheikh did not receive a plaque because he had been provided a salary in return for his services. The dinner in honor of the sheikh was the only dinner held at KHALID and NAWAF's apartment and the only dinner held by AL-BAYOUMI during the time that KHALID and NAWAF lived at Parkwood Apartments. AL-BAYOUMI did not host any kind of "welcoming" party in honor of KHALID and NAWAF.

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AL-BAYOUMI recalled that the dinner was videotaped with his video camera, but that some individuals did not want to appear on the videotape. When asked about his reportedly constant use of his video camera, AL-BAYOUMI advised that he enjoyed videotaping events such as family gatherings, lectures, and dinners in order to remember the events. However, AL-BAYOUMI would not describe himself as constantly using his video camera.

AL-BAYOUMI recalled that KHALID and NAWAF submitted a notice-to-vacate form shortly after moving in to Parkwood Apartments because they felt it was too costly to live there. AL-BAYOUMI did not fill out the notice-to-vacate form on their behalf, nor was he present when KHALID and NAWAF submitted the form. AL-BAYOUMI did not know the date on which KHALID and NAWAF submitted the form. When shown a copy of the notice-to-vacate form, AL-BAYOUMI advised that he did not recognize the form and that his handwriting did not appear on the form [Note: this copy is enclosed in a FD-340 within the case file]. AL-BAYOUMI was aware that KHALID and NAWAF were planning to move into the apartment of HASHIM AL-ATTAS, a student in San Diego who was going to be returning to Saudi Arabia. AL-BAYOUMI had known AL-ATTAS for a long time through school and would see and call him often. AL-BAYOUMI did not know how KHALID and NAWAF knew AL-ATTAS.


AL-BAYOUMI did not recognize the name GEORGE HARB, but thought that AL-ATTAS may have used his telephone to call HARB since HARB was AL-ATTAS' landlord. Neither KHALID or NAWAF ever used AL-BAYOUMI's cellular telephone, nor did they ever enter his apartment and use his telephone. AL-BAYOUMI did not call HARB on their behalf, nor did he assist KHALID and NAWAF in any way to move into AL-ATTAS' apartment. While he was not certain, AL-BAYOUMI recalled hearing that KHALID and NAWAF had moved into AL-ATTAS' apartment for two weeks, then returned to their apartment at Parkwood Apartments. AL-BAYOUMI was in Washington, DC, during that time.

AL-BAYOUMI had departed San Diego for Washington, DC, a couple of weeks after KHALID and NAWAF moved into Parkwood Apartments. While in Washington, DC, AL-BAYOUMI attended two or three consecutive seminars at George Washington University over a period of approximately 15-25 days. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall the dates on which these seminars took place. These seminars were held in the Watergate building. After completing the seminars, AL-BAYOUMI returned to San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI then departed San Diego for Saudi Arabia, where he stayed approximately two months for his

employment. Al-BAYOUMI's wife and children remained in San Diego during the times he traveled to both Washington, DC, and Saudi Arabia.

Upon his return from Saudi Arabia, Al-BAYOUMI recalled hearing that KHALID and NAWAF had moved from Parkwood Apartments to the residence of DR. ABDUSATTAR SHEIKH. AL-BAYOUMI did not know when KHALID and NAWAF first met SHEIKH, nor how they were introduced. AL-BAYOUMI did not know why they had decided to move out of Parkwood Apartments and into the residence of SHEIKH. After they moved out of Parkwood Apartments, AL-BAYOUMI saw KHALID and NAWAF at the mosque on one or two occasions.

As AL-BAYOUMI was traveling during much of the time that KHALID and NAWAF lived at Parkwood Apartments, he did not have a great deal of contact with either of them. On a few occasions, AL-BAYOUMI and his eldest son EMAD visited their apartment to say hello. During these visits, KHALID and NAWAF often would joke with each other by pushing or shoving. AL-BAYOUMI did not like how they acted towards each other and did not want his son to observe such conduct. Because of their behavior, AL-BAYOUMI stopped visiting their apartment.

AL-BAYOUMI could not recall any one or more individuals in San Diego with whom KHALID and NAWAF spent a significant amount of time. AL-BAYOUMI did not know of any individuals who assisted KHALID and/or NAWAF in obtaining driver's licenses or any other forms of identification, but AL-BAYOUMI noted that everyone at the mosque is always willing to help newcomers to the community. AL-BAYOUMI did not recognize the name MUSTAFA AHMED.

AL-BAYOUMI did not introduce either KHALID or NAWAF to MOHDAR ABDULLAH, but believed that they knew each other from the mosque. AL-BAYOUMI recalled seeing ABDULLAH with KHALID and NAWAF at the mosque. AL-BAYOUMI did not instruct ABDULLAH to translate or to contact flight schools on their behalf, nor did he direct ABDULLAH to provide them with any assistance.

AL-BAYOUMI identified the name of OSAMA BASNAN as an acquaintance whose wife is friends with AL-BAYOUMI's wife. AL-BAYOUMI advised that he himself did not care much for BASNAN, but their wives were close friends. AL-BAYOUMI did not introduce BASNAN to KHALID and/or NAWAF, but recalled seeing them together at the mosque.

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AL-BAYOUMI did not know either KHALID or NAWAF to have worked while in San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI was not sure if both KHALID and NAWAF attended the local community college to learn English. AL-BAYOUMI recalled seeing KHALID and NAWAF working out in the exercise room at Parkwood Apartments on one or two occasions. AL-BAYOUMI never saw either KHALID or NAWAF use a computer, and he never spoke with either KHALID or NAWAF about computers or the internet. AL-BAYOUMI did not recall ever emailing either KHALID or NAWAF.

AL-BAYOUMI never spoke to either KHALID or NAWAF about politics, to include jihad, martyrdom, or anti-American sentiments. Neither politics nor radical views were allowed to be discussed at the mosque. AL-BAYOUMI never discussed marriage or family with either KHALID or NAWAF. AL-BAYOUMI was not aware that KHALID and NAWAF had attended flight training while living in San Diego, and neither KHALID nor NAWAF ever spoke to AL-BAYOUMI about flight training

AL-BAYOUMI again departed San Diego alone in 10/2000 and traveled to the United Kingdom where he enrolled in the doctorate program in business ethics at Aston University. AL-BAYOUMI planned to attend school for two years in the United Kingdom and finish the third year with his dissertation in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. AL-BAYOUMI returned to San Diego, where his family was still residing, between semesters at Aston. In the summer of 2001, upon the completion of the children's school year, AL-BAYOUMI's wife and children moved with him to the United Kingdom.

After being taken into custody in the United Kingdom [Note: AL-BAYOUMI was detained by New Scotland Yard on 09/21/2001], AL-BAYOUMI spoke with DR. NASSER [phonetic], with whom he was associated through school. NASSER subsequently called the Cultural Attache at the Saudi Arabian Embassy on behalf of AL-BAYOUMI. The Cultural Attache tried to contact AL-BAYOUMI but could not get in touch with him. AL-BAYOUMI subsequently spoke with Embassy employee TALAL MOSLAMATI [phonetic]. AL-BAYOUMI had consulted with the Embassy because the British authorities wanted to audiotape and videotape their interviews with AL-BAYOUMI, and AL-BAYOUMI sought the advice of the Embassy on allowing them to do so.

After being arrested in the United Kingdom, AL-BAYOUMI did not finish the second year of the doctorate program. AL-BAYOUMI advised that he had to drop out of the program because his computer and other materials were taken during the search of his

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residence [Note: AL-BAYOUMI became visibly upset while talking about dropping out of the doctorate program]. AL-BAYOUMI left the doctorate program and subsequently completed the master's program in business ethics in 2002. After finishing the master's program, AL-BAYOUMI and his family returned to Saudi Arabia.

Other than his salary and stipends, AL-BAYOUMI did not receive any other money from the government of Saudi Arabia. AL-BAYOUMI did not have advanced knowledge of the terrorist attacks that took place on 09/11/2001. AL-BAYOUMI has never attended training camps or received any training from Al Qaeda, nor is he affiliated with any individuals involved in terrorism or with any terrorist activity. AL-BAYOUMI advised that he is not a member of any terrorist organization.

When asked about media reports that he is an intelligence officer, AL-BAYOUMI advised that such reports were "absolutely not true" and that he was not a Saudi Arabian intelligence officer. AL-BAYOUMI advised that he is an innocent person and just wants to clear his name. AL-BAYOUMI advised that he respects America and American people, and that his children consider themselves to be American. AL-BAYOUMI stated that his youngest daughter is a "Bush supporter" who cheers for Bush when he appears on television.

When asked of his willingness to submit to a polygraph examination, AL-BAYOUMI advised that he was not familiar with the polygraph and that he did not understand the concept of a polygraph examination. AL-BAYOUMI advised that he would most likely consult an attorney before submitting to a polygraph examination.

SUBJECT: Request for Discovery - ECF References to Possible Ties to the Saudi Arabian Government, Embassies, or Consulates

- 1. Pursuant to R.M.C. 701, 10 U.S.C. § 949j (2012), the Fifth, Sixth, and Eighth Amendments to the United States Constitution, and international law, Mr. bin Atash requests that the Government provide the following information in discovery. Failure to provide the requested information will deprive Mr. bin Atash of his right to the due process of law, the effective assistance of counsel, a fair, speedy, and public trial, and to be free from cruel and unusual punishment.
- 2. The attached 20-page document, released by the FBI in redacted form in at least two different versions (Encl 1 & Eucl 2), provides "chronological summaries of Electronic Case File (ECF) references regarding possible ties of [presumably some person or entity] to the Saudi Arabian Government, Embassies or Consulates." It cites to numerous FBI documents by their serial number. For example, the serial number "265A-NY-28350-302 serial 7792" appears on Page 1 of the attached 20-page document. Counsel for Mr. bin Atash are unable to determine whether they have already received any of these documents in discovery because even unclassified FBI discovery is provided to them only with a Bates Number generated by Trial Counsel, with the original FBI serial numbers either redacted or deleted.
- Mr. bin Atash through counsel respectfully requests:
 - An unredacted copy of the attached document.
- Unreducted copies of each reference listed, mentioned, or cited in the attached document, regardless of how the document is listed, mentioned, or cited, i.e. whether by serial number, date, description, or in some other way.
- 4. The Government must produce information that is "material to the preparation of the defense" where the information is "within the possession, custody, or control of the Government." R.M.C. 701(c); R.M.C. 703(c)(2) & (f)(4)(B). Trial Counsel's duty with respect to discovery goes far beyond their files; they are required to affirmatively look for discoverable materials in the possession of other Government agencies. See Kyles v. Whitley, 514 U.S. 419, 437 (1995); United States v. Williams, 50 M.J. 436, 441 (C.A.A.F. 1999). The Defense is under an obligation to conduct a full and independent investigation of conduct alleged against Mr. bin Atash. Counsel's inability to conduct this investigation denies Mr. bin Atash his right to due process, the effective assistance of counsel, a fair, speedy, and public trial, and to be free from cruel and usual punishment. Furthermore, one of the central aspects of the Government's jurisdiction in this case relies upon Mr. bin Atash being an "unprivileged enemy belligerent." 10 U.S.C. § 949a(7). Evidence relevant to a foreign government's involvement in the attacks of September 11 is material to the issue of whether Mr. bin Atash is a privileged belligerent. A foreign government's involvement also is also material as to Mr. bin Atash's relative culpability and the issue of whether the United States engaged in outrageous government misconduct due to their obfuscation and concealment of this evidence. The requested information will lead to other discoverable information such as other investigations, witnesses, and evidence. Failure to provide these materials in an expedient manner will cause further delays in this case.

In the case of FBI documents, it includes unredacted copies, of the original typescript FD-302s and other FBI documents, with their serial numbers.
 - b. "Information" means any knowledge that can be communicated or documentary material, regardless of its physical form or characteristics, and to include handwritten, recorded, or electronic documents. When used with respect to a document, the word "information" includes any knowledge of the sender, recipient, and date of transmittal of a transmitted document. Where information responsive to a request is not contained in a document, it includes a summary of the information and the name and contact information of a person with knowledge of the information. When information was contained in a document that no longer exists, it includes a summary of the content of that document and the circumstances of its destruction.
 - c. "Produce" means to convey to the defense without redaction (except as authorized by the military commission pursuant to M.C.R.E. 505), and without redaction or alteration of any electronically stored information associated with the document. If the military commission authorizes substitutions or redactions pursuant to M.C.R.E. 505, the word "produce" includes a notation of the Appellate Exhibit number of the order authorizing the substitutions or redactions. To the extent that responsive documents are subject to the attorney-client or other applicable privilege, the word "produce" means to provide a privilege log of any withheld information or documents, along with the facts disclosed in

- Pursuant to RMC 701, 10 U.S.C. § 949j (2009), the Fifth, Sixth, and Eighth Amendments to the United States Constitution, and international law, Mr. bin 'Atash requests that the Government provide the following information in discovery. Failure to provide the requested information will deprive Mr. bin 'Atash of his rights to the due process of law, to the effective assistance of counsel, to a fair, speedy, and public trial, and to be free from cruel and unusual punishment.
- 2. In March 2015, an unclassified version of the report of the Congressionally-mandated "9/11 Review Commission" was released. (This commission is to be distinguished from the better-known National Commission on Terrorist Attacks Upon the United States—the "9/11 Commission."). The 9/11 Review Commission, also known as the Meese Commission, was authorized by Congress to conduct an "external review" of the FBI's performance in implementing the original 9/11 Commission's recommendations and to assess new evidence. FBI Director James Comey picked the Meese Commission's members, who operated in virtual secrecy, holding no public hearings and releasing no records about its work beyond its March 2015 final report. The report, entitled "The FBI: Protecting the Homeland in the 21st Century," discusses the implementation of the 9/11 Commission's recommendations as well as analyzing new information that was not available at the time of the original 9/11 Commission's report.
- a. In a section beginning on page 101 of the unclassified version of its report, the Review Commission notes the existence of an FBI "subfile" established "to sharpen the focus on the lingering allegations that the circle of 9/11 conspirators may be wider." The "subfile" conducted a "review of several individuals of interest" and "describe[ed] its work to the Review Commission."

(U) FBI Investigations

(U) The FBI's instal investigation into the 9/11 attacks was named PENTTBOM. This effort remains open and active. Subsequent to the initial 9/11 Commission report, the FBI opened a subfile within this investigation to sharpen the focus on the lingering allegations that the circle of 9/11 conspirators may be wider. The 9/11 Review Commission reviewed the status of both the PENTTBOM and staffile teams.

At the conclusion of a brief discussion of Nawaf al-Hazmi, Khalid al-Mihdhar, and their associations with Omar al-Bayoumi, Fahad al-Thumairy, and Mohdhar Abdullah in Southern California, the Review Commission notes the existence of "ongoing internal debate within the FBI between the original PENTTBOM team and the subfile team regarding the potential significance" of new material bearing on the issue of "witting assistance" to Hazmi and Mihdhar.³

(U) Finding: The Review Commission finds that this new information is not sufficient to change the 9-11 Commission's original findings regarding the presence of witting assistance to at-Hazmi and st-Mihdhar. The Review Commission notes that there is ongoing internal debate within the FBI between the original PENTIBOM team and the subfile team regarding the potential significance of some of the information. The Review Commission recognizes the importance of string internal engagement between the PENTIBOM said the subfile teams. The Review Commission recommends that the FBI leadership review both perspectives and continue the investigation accordinally.

The report states that "[n]one of this evidence identifies any additional participants in the planning or carrying out of the 9/11 attacks," and that "[t]his evidence does strengthen and enhance the cases against the existing plotters." For these propositions, the report cites a Memorandum for the Record (MFR), dated 24 October 2014.

(U) Guantanamo Bay Trial Preparation

(U) The second effort devoted to uncovering new evidence involves the trial preparations by the al-Qa ida defendants currently held at Grantanamo Bay. This effort focuses on examination of materials obtained both pre- said post-2004, including materials from the Abbottabad raid, search warrants and the recorded conversations of key individuals. Note of this evidence identifies any additional participosis in the planning or carrying out of the 9/11 attacks. This evidence does strengthen and enhance the cases against existing plotters.

(U) Finding: The Review Commission finds that this new evidence further substantiates and strengthens previously known connections between hijsckers and other plotters and reinforcesthe cases against them.¹³⁸

In a section beginning on page 105, entitled "The Sarasota Family," the Review Commission considers press allegations that the FBI "found troubling ties between the hijackers and residents in an upscale community" near Sarasota, Florida. This apparently pertains to press reports that FBI agents found "many connections" between the family of Abdulaziz al-Hijji and his wife the former Anoud Esam Ghazzawi of 4224 Escondito Cir, Sarasota, Florida 34238 and "individuals associated with the terrorist attacks on 9/11/2001."
- 3. All information regarding the September 11, 2001 attacks, the alleged conspiracy, and the resulting investigation is material to the preparation of the defense. Mr. bin 'Atash therefore respectfully requests:

- b. All supporting documents, reports, intelligence briefings, chronologies, digests, subfile team documents including research or analysis MFRs and the like and submissions to the Review Commission, and other information used to create "Chapter V: New Information Related to the 9/11 Attacks."
- c. Unredacted copies of all interviews regarding the 9/11 attacks, the conspiracy to commit them, or persons alleged to have been involved or potentially involved in the conspiracy, as found in the 9/11 Review Commission report, Appendix B, "Interviews Conducted by the 9/11 Review Commission."
- d. Unredacted copies of all briefing materials, and notes of all briefings, regarding the 9/11 attacks, the conspiracy to commit them, or persons alleged to have been involved or potentially involved in the conspiracy, as found in the 9/11 Review Commission report, Appendix A, "Briefs Provided by FB! Headquarters' Divisions."

SUBJECT: Request for Discovery—Judicial Watch FOIA Document ("Saudi and al-Aulagi Connections to 9/11")

- 1. Pursuant to RMC 701, 10 U.S.C. § 949j (2013), the Fifth, Sixth, and Eighth Amendments to the United States Constitution, and international law, Mr. bin Atash requests that the Government provide the following information in discovery. Failure to provide the requested information will deprive Mr. bin Atash of his rights to the due process of law, to the effective assistance of counsel, a fair, speedy, and public trial, and to be free from cruel and unusual punishment.
- 2. Mr. bin Atash is charged with conspiracy. His alleged co-conspirators include Nawaf al Hazmi and Khalid al Mihdhar. According to the 9/11 Commission Report, a "potentially significant San Diego contact for Hazmi and Mihdhar" was Anwar Nasser Aulaqi. Aulaqi was known to the FBI even before 9/11: "The FBI investigated Aulaqi in 1999 and 2000 after learning that he may have been contacted by a possible procurement agent for Bin Laden." "We do not know," the report says, "how or when Hazmi and Mihdhar first met Aulaqi. The operatives may even have met or at least talked to him the same day they first moved to San Diego. Hazmi and Mihdhar reportedly respected Aulaqi as a religious figure and developed a close relationship with him." According to an early post-9/11 FBI letterhead memorandum, Aulaqi was, among other things, "the spiritual leader of [Hazmi] and [Mihdhar]" and Aulaqi "met consistently and privately with [Hazmi] and [Mihdhar] for prayers and the Juma." The same memo stated that data related to an intensive analysis of Aulaqi sactivities and associates "suggests a more pervasive connection between [Hazmi] and Aulaqi that what he admitted to during his interview with the FBI. "6 Aulaqi is now unavailable for interview, having been killed by the United States in 2011."
- 3. On or about 31 December 2013, Judicial Watch obtained via the Freedom of Information Act a number of FBI documents pertaining to Aulaqi and other San Diego associates of Hazmi and Mihdhar, including Omar al-Bayoumi.

 Budicial Watch has published these documents on its website in the form of a 79-page PDF file which they entitled "Sandi and al-Aulaqi Connections to 9/11."

The FBI received numerous reports from individuals in the Muslim community, dating back to 1999, alleging that Bayoumi was a Saudi intelligence officer. Joint Inquiry Report at 416. According to an FBI document dated 14 October 2002, Bayoumi had "extensive ties to the Saudi Government." Id, at 423. The 9/11 Commission said that while Bayoumi was the object of considerable media speculation following 9/11, and he is "well aware of his notonety," it saw no credible evidence that Bayoumi believed in violent extremism or knowingly aided extremist groups, and that its investigators found him to be an unlikely candidate for clandestine involvement with Islamist extremists. 9/11 Commission Report at 218.

The documents include numerous redactions and some pages marked "deleted page information sheet" substituted for duplicate pages or pages that were withheld.5

- Mr. bin Atash through Counsel respectfully requests:
- a. Complete and unreducted copies of all documents included or represented by deleted page information sheets in the 79-page PDF file on the Judicial Watch website entitled "Saudi and al-Aulaqi Connections to 9/11." ¹¹⁰
- b. The following documents pertaining to Anlaqi which are cited on page 571 of the 9/11 Commission Report (Chapter 7, note 33):

 - (1) "Wade A. interview (Oct. 16, 2003)."
 (2) "FB1 electronic communication, background searches, Feb. 3, 2000."
 - (3) "FBI report of investigation, interview, Sept. 24, 2001."
 - (4) "FBI electronic communication, interview, Oct. 8, 2002."
- (5) "Steve O. interview (Nov. 17, 2003), noting that four calls took place between Aulaqi's phone and Bayoumi's phone on February 4, 2000, the day Bayoumi helped Hazmi and Mihdhar find an apartment and perhaps lent them his phone."
- 5. The Government must produce information that is "material to the preparation of the defense" where the information is "within the possession, custody, or control of the Government." R.M.C. 701(c). The requested discovery is material and helpful to the preparation of Mr. bin'Atash's defense because it may connect officials of the Saudi state to funding and planning of the attacks of 9/11 the very crime with which Mr. bin Atash is charged. Additionally, it may point to the existence of coconspirators in the 9/11 operation who perhaps went unrecognized by U.S. authorities, or who e.g. for reasons of state security may have been deliberately passed over. Any and all information regarding the planning, funding, and support for the crimes that Mr. bin Atash is alleged to have committed is discoverable to the defense, including but not limited to information pointing to the existence of state actors, other individuals who are culpable of aiding in the alleged crime, support networks known to the United States government which were or are being protected from responsibility and exposure, deliberate decisions to let the plot continue undisturbed, and selective prosecution. Uncovering those who are more responsible than Mr. bin 'Atash is mitigating as it demonstrates his lack of relative culpability. Additionally, by allowing those directly responsible to go free while lower level operatives are charged is outrageous government misconduct and is mitigating. These documents will assist the defense and may potentially lead to other discoverable information such as other investigations, witnesses, and evidence related to such matters, or to other exculpatory or favorable evidence and/or evidence in mitigation. Failure to provide these materials in an expedient manner will further delay Mr. bin Atash's case.

FBI BA currently has SCHEREMETA under physical surveillance and will attempt to interview her on 9/22/2001 to determine any nexus to this investigation.

(DES/OC) FBI BA has placed KHALID MOHAMMAD ALI under surveillance. On 9/21/2001, ALI traveled to the Crystal City area in Northern Virginia and visited a Kinko's copy store there for two hours and 20 minutes. ALI spent most of that time duplicating blank pages of a day planner book. ALI also met with several Middle Eastern individuals in the morning. On 9/21/2001, ALI was observed at a Dennys restaurant depositing a keyless remote vehicle entry device, which was wrapped in two plastic bags inside of a third bag, into a trash receptacle and then remaining in the vicinity of the receptacle for several hours. The device was eventually recovered and transported to ERF, Quantico, for analysis. ALI is currently wanted for felony vehicle theft (local warrant) for the taking of a vehicle from Dar Cars, Rockville, MD, in January 2001. Previous investigation determined that ALI resided in various Laurel/College Park, MD, motels since June 2001, as well as being tentatively identified by a motel manager as a possible associate of HANI HANJOUR (AA Flt. #77). Due to the fact that ALI has been exhibiting unusual behavior (visiting Kinkos, performing ATM transactions, moving from motel to motel in the Laurel/College Park area, etc.) ALI is remaining under surveillance until thorough financial, cellular telephone and other records checks are completed. He will then be arrested and interviewed. Investigation continuing.

(NES) of 9/21/2001, FBI BA was advised of suspicious activity in the vicinity of the Newcastle County (Delaware) Airport. Investigation was conducted that resulted in arrests by local law enforcement of four Middle Eastern males, identified as MUSTAFA CAMCI (DPOB 6/15/1977 in Turkey. out of status. counterfeit passport purported to be of exceptional quality. employed as painter. jumped ship in Houston, TX on 4/23/2000); SADULLAH SAKA (DPOB 1/1/1965 in Turkey. out of status. arrived on tourist visa at New York City in 11/1996. Boston

Investigative Efforts:

Northwest Airlines Flight #345 en route to Logan International Airport (LIA) in Boston was deplaned because the cockpit door strike plate was missing. Initial investigation determined that the strike plate was in place prior to landing in Detroit. One theory is that the plane was prepared for a terrorist takeover at some point on 9/22/2001 in Boston. That plane was scheduled on 9/22/2001 to fly to San Francisco via Detroit. FBI Boston (FBI BS) is obtaining the manifest of the flight to review it for names on the Security Directives List. Results of investigation will be provided to SIOC and appropriate field offices.

(hes/oc) Investigation by FBI BS has determined that a photograph obtained from the vehicle of NAWAF ALHAZMI (AA Flt. #77) appears to be identical with Flight 175 subject AHMED ALGHAMDI (UA Flt. #175). The photograph, which was obtained by FBI WFO, was superimposed over a known photograph of ALGHAMDI and it appears to be a positive match. Investigation continuing.

advised FBI BS that an Arabic male answered the door of the room at approximately 11:00 a.m. on the morning of 9/11/2001. The male asked her to come back later to clean because someone in the room was sleeping. This hotel is where WALEED ALSHEHRI (AA Flt. #11) and WAIL ALSHEHRI (AA Flt. #11) stayed the night before the attack. FBI BS has initiated logical investigation to identify the unknown Arab male. Results will be provided to SIOC and appropriate field offices.

(LES/ec) FBI BS tentatively identified the Charles Hotel as the place where AHMED ALGHAMDI (UA Flt. #175) and HAMZA ALGHAMDI (UA Flt. #175) stayed while in Boston. This preliminary determination is based upon telephone records, ATM records, and a taxi driver who reportedly drove them from the Charles Hotel to the Days Inn Hotel. FBI BS is currently reviewing hotel records to confirm that these subjects stayed at this hotel. Results will be provided. Investigation continuing.

(LES/SC) FBI BS has identified a credit card for MUSTAFA AHMED, who is believed to have been the person who received the Western Union wire transfers from the subjects in the week prior to 9/11/2001. This information was passed to the financial analysis team.

STEPHANIE CREIGHTON, a travel agent from Providence, RI, reported that a customer named JUMA WADI purchased a ticket on a Virgin Atlantic flight to Johannesburg via London. Following his purchase, he made several pro-terrorist statements. Since the initial purchase, WADI has changed his flight two times. The flight now leaves from JFK on 9/24/2001. FBI NYO has been made aware of the potential threat and will interview WADI prior to takeoff. Investigation continuing.

that Delta Flight #1479 will be hijacked on 9/22/2001. Information was originally provided by US Customs Service from a 9/17 interview of a walk-in source. This source was on Delta Flight #1479 on 9/6/2001 and claims to have observed Arab passengers allegedly conducting "pre-operational surveillance." FBI BS obtained a manifest for this flight. A review of this manifest showed a possible individual on the Security Directives Watch List on this flight. The manifest shows a AFZAL QUAIS. FAISAL S. AFZAL is #2 on the Security Directives Watch List. FAISAL S. AFZAL was interviewed and polygraphed by FBI BA with negative results. Based on these results, FBI BA recommends that AFZAL be removed from the Watch List. However, FBI BS will conduct all logical investigation to insure the safety of the FL #1479 passengers.

Chicago

Investigative Efforts:

(DES/SE) As previously reported, NABIL AL-MARABH (DOB 11/6/1966) was identified as #27 on the Security Directives List and was arrested by FBI Chicago (FBI CG) and local authorities. On 9/21/2001, AL-MARABH failed a polygraph examination. He was deceptive for the two key questions: "Were you involved in the planning of the events on 9/11/2001?" and "Did you participate in the planning of the events on 9/11/2001?". After the failed polygraph, AL-MARABH became cooperative and started providing information regarding his roles in training camps in Afghanistan and Sudan. Interviews of AL-MARABH will continue on 9/22/2001.



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Analysis of cellular and home telephone records is continuing. It is anticipated that AL-MARABH will be removed to New York upon the issuance of a Material Witness Warrant out of the Southern District of New York. Investigation continuing.

determined that known terrorists may have been traveling under non-Arabic names to conduct recomnaissance runs in preparation for the attacks. Specifically, an American Airlines pilot has identified MARWAN AL-SHEHHI (UA Flt. #175) as a passenger of AA Flight #59 on 6/7/2001. Just prior to flight's departure, AL-SHEHHI requested a tour of the cockpit. AL-SHEHHI presented his pilot's license and boarding pass to the pilot during this tour. AL-SHEHHI was seated in First Class and is believed to have been traveling with another party. An analysis of the flight manifest suggests that AL-SHEHHI may have been flying under the name of MATTHEW COHEN. Investigation continuing.

Detroit

Investigative Efforts:

FAROUK AL-HAIMOUD, and AHMED HANNAN were arrested in NABIL AL-MARABH's apartment on 9/18/2001 for identity fraud and fraudulent use of a visa. On 9/21/2001, these three individuals were ordered detained during a hearing before a United States Magistrate Judge for the Eastern District of Michigan. The judge has subsequently received threatening telephone calls and is receiving protection from the U.S. Marshals. On 09/20/2001, a "JOHN DOE" (aka MICHAEL SAISA JALALI) arrest warrant was issued

SHEFFIELD, while providing security at the U.S. Courthouse, Detroit, was shot and killed on 9/21/2001 by DAVID DANIEL SERRA (3/24/1973). SHEFFIELD was providing security at the U.S. Courthouse in Detroit, MI. SERRA, while waiting to pass through the metal-detector, was determined by FPSO SHEFFIELD, to possess a bag containing a nickel-plated revolver. Before SERRA could be disarmed, he shot and killed FPSO SHEFFIELD. SERRA was shot and wounded by other officers present. He is currently in a hospital bed under guard by FBI Detroit (FBI DE). Based upon information and physical evidence found in his car, SERRA appears to be a mentally-deranged person who was under the influence of drugs at the time of the shooting. The shooting does not appear to be related to the investigation. When able, SERRA will be interviewed by FBI DE to determine if there is any nexus to the PENTTBOM investigation.

who reported suspicious activity involving an apartment unit abandoned by AHMAD ABDUL AL-TURAYIF and AMMAR FARRAJ ALJUHANI, who recently completed flight engineer training in Houston. Pursuant to a consent search, FBI Houston (FBI HO) recovered a computer, unopened letters, a Rolodex, and miscellaneous items from the abandoned apartment. A mirror copy of the computer hard

indicated that HANI HANJOUR (AA Flt. #77) and KHALID ALMIHDHAR (AA Flt. #77) had resided in the Louisville area. FBI Louisville (FBI LS) investigation revealed no links between individuals in Kentucky and the suspected hijackers. However, it now appears the individuals identified were look-alikes.
