**ORDER**

**Protective Order For Convening Authority  
To Protect Defense Team Claims for  
Compensation**

**5 February 2019**

WHEREAS, the Commission has the power to issue this Order under the Military Commissions Act of 2009, 10 U.S.C. § 948a *et seq.*, the Rules for Military Commission 703 and 806, and the Regulation for Trial by Military Commission ¶17-4;

THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Convening Authority shall not disclose to the Prosecution or to the public any information relating to (a) payments authorized or made for the services of learned counsel or experts; (b) hours of work authorized for or used by learned counsel or experts; (c) any documentation submitted by learned counsel or experts in support of a claim for compensation, unless subsequently ordered by the Military Judge to do so. Nothing in this Order affects the discovery responsibilities of the parties under R.M.C. 701, R.M.C. 914, or other applicable rules of discovery.
