## 1. Timeliness

This Notice by the Special Review Team ("SRT") is timely filed.

## 2. Facts

Pursuant to the Commission's Interim Order in AE 615H, an *ex parte* hearing was held on January 24, 2019, where counsel from the Special Review Team appeared before the Commission.

During this hearing, counsel for the SRT provided the Commission with a declaration from Daniel Purtill, Director of Security, Washington Headquarters Services ("WHS"), Department of Defense ("DoD"). A redacted copy of this declaration is included with this Notice as Attachment B. As Mr. Purtill's declaration makes clear, a review of the security clearance status for all known defense team members demonstrates that there are no pending DoD security clearance actions other than routine matters such as, for example, reinvestigations or upgrades to clearances that are being conducted by the National Background Investigations Bureau. As a result, there is no factual basis for an alleged conflict of interest based on security clearance status.

The SRT does not request oral argument on this Notice.

# Declaration of Daniel Purtill

24 January 2019

- I, Daniel Purtill, am the Director of Security, Washington Headquarters Services (WHS), Department of Defense. The Washington Headquarters Services Office of Special Security (WHS OSS), the security program office for the Office of Military Commissions (OMC), reports directly to me.
- 2. I make this declaration at the request of the Department of Justice Special Review Team (DOJ SRT) in the Military Commissions case of *United States v. Mohammad, et al.*.
- 3. On 16 January 2019, WHS OSS provided the DOJ SRT with the identities of known defense team members who are OMC personnel assigned, as of 11 January 2019, to the Military Commissions Defense Organization (MCDO) 9/11 defense teams and who have been identified by the MCDO to WHS OSS for the purpose of tracking the status of DoD security clearances and accesses.
- 4. The WHS Security Office requested that the DoD Consolidated Adjudications Facility (DoD CAF) provide the DoD security clearance status of all MCDO 9/11 defense team members that have been identified by the MCDO to WHS OSS for the purpose of tracking the status of DoD security clearances and accesses.<sup>1</sup>

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> It is my understanding that MCDO defense teams have asserted potential conflict of interest in this case and have stated that AE 2929QQ, Amended Order, generally sets forth requirements for *ex parte* and in camera notice to the Commission of FBI and security clearance investigations of known defense team members. While AE 292QQ Amended Order references the DIA CAF, its jurisdictional authority to adjudicate SCI clearances for OMC employees was realigned to the DoD CAF on 1 July 2016.
