RULING

Mr. al Baluchi's Motion
To Permit the Absence of Detailed Defense
Counsel Pursuant to R.M.C. 805(c)

12 February 2019

- 1. Counsel for Mr. Ali (a.k.a. al Baluchi) moved¹ to excuse Detailed Defense Counsel, Lt Col Sterling R. Thomas, from the Commission hearings scheduled between 18 29 March 2019. *See* Rule for Military Commissions 805(c). Mr. Ali consents to the absence. The Government does not oppose the motion.²
- 2. Counsel for Mr. Ali have asserted that other qualified counsel, to include Learned Counsel, will be present to represent Mr. Ali. The Defense has not requested a continuance. The Commission finds under the circumstances the Accused's right to be adequately represented during hearings scheduled between 18 29 March 2019 will not be impaired by Lt Col Thomas' absence.
- 3. The motion is **GRANTED**.
