Temporary Extension of Briefing and Litigation  
Suspense Due to Impacts of  
Coronavirus COVID-19

**20 August 2020**

1. On 24 July 2020, in AE 788 (6<sup>th</sup> Sup)/AE 639HH (5<sup>th</sup> Sup),<sup>1</sup> the Commission *sua sponte* extended the existing 120 day extension of all briefing and litigation suspense dates scheduled to occur on or after 26 March 2020 (as set forth in Commission’s litigation schedule)<sup>2</sup> for an additional 30 calendar days, thereby increasing the filing extension to a total of 150 calendar days.

2. In light of the continuing impact of Coronavirus COVID-19, the Commission hereby increases the existing 150 day extension by another **30 calendar days**. Accordingly, all briefing and litigation suspense dates scheduled to occur on or after 26 March 2020 as set forth in the litigation schedule<sup>3</sup> are extended for a total of **180 calendar days**. The procedures regarding classified filings during this period of extension shall remain as set forth in AE 788 (3<sup>rd</sup> Sup) / AE 639HH (2<sup>nd</sup> Sup).
