1. This Order amends the AE 950 Docket Order series,¹ to adjust the schedule for the third week of the **15 July – 9 August 2024** hearing session at U.S. Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay (NSGB), Cuba by changing the sequence of the testimony of the witnesses and notifying the Parties that the testimony will begin at **0900 on Monday, 29 July 2024** in a classified session that will be **closed to the public**.

a. Paragraph 5.a.(4) is amended, to read:

(1) Special Agent (SA) Maria Jocys, FBI (Retired), testifying from NSGB Courtroom 2 on or about 1 – 2 August 2024, following the testimony of the Former Camp 7 Commander;

(2) Lieutenant Commander (LCDR) David Hanrahan, testifying at an undetermined date and time in the future;

(3) Former Camp 7 Commander² from September 2006 – May 2008, testifying from the RHR, beginning in a closed session at 0900, on Monday, 29 July 2024, to be followed by open sessions, as needed, later in the week.³

2. The remainder of the Docket Order remains unchanged.
