

Improper Delegation of Statutory Obligations Motion

On September 26, 2014, appellee filed a motion for appropriate relief requesting the Court to “terminate the devolution of its judicial responsibilities onto the Clerk of Court.” On September 29, 2014, appellant filed its opposition recognizing that the Clerk of Court “performs ministerial functions that clerks of court typically perform in courts throughout the United States” and that “[t]he Clerk does not direct or supervise the Court.”

As the Clerk of this Court exercises no judicial responsibilities and neither rule nor practice endow the Clerk of this Court with any such responsibility, we hold appellee’s motion to be without merit and deny the same.

Therefore, it is hereby

ORDERED that appellee’s motion that Judges Krauss and Weber recuse themselves from appellee’s case is **DENIED**.

ORDERED that appellee’s motion regarding our Court’s improper delegation of its statutory obligations is **DENIED**.
