CHARGE I: Violation of 10 U.S.C. §950v(b)(28), Conspiracy

Specification:

In that from on or about October 2001 to on or about 22 July 2002, at or near Khowst, Afghanistan, OBAIDULLAH, a.k.a. Bertola, Baitullah, Ubaidullah Hancef, and Abajdullah, a person subject to trial by military commission as an alien unlawful enemy combatant, did conspire and agree with other individuals, both known and unknown, to commit offenses triable by military commission, to wit: intentionally causing serious bodily injury to one or more persons in violation of the law of war, murder in violation of the law of war, and providing material support to terrorism, all the while knowing the unlawful purpose of the agreement and willfully joining the agreement with the intent to further its unlawful purpose, and did knowingly commit an overt act in order to effect the object of that conspiracy, including, but not limited to the following:

- 1. On or about 22 July 2002, at or near Khowst, Afghanistan, OBAIDULLAH, a.k.a. Bertola, Baitullah, Ubaidullah Haneef, and Abajdullah, stored and concealed anti-tank mines, other explosive devices, and related equipment;
- 2. On or about 22 July 2002, at or near Khowst, Afghanistan, OBAIDULLAH, a.k.a. Bertola, Baitullah, Ubaidullah Haneef, and Abajdullah, concealed on his person a notebook describing how to wire and detonate explosive devices.

CHARGE II: Violation of 10 U.S.C. § 950v(b)(25), Providing Material Support to Terrorism

Specification:

In that from on or about October 2001 to on or about 22 July 2002, at or near Khowst, Afghanistan, OBAIDULLAH, a.k.a. Bertola, Baitullah, Ubaidullah Hancef, and Abajdullah, a person subject to trial by military commission as an alien unlawful enemy combatant, in the context of and associated with an armed conflict, did provide material support and resources, to wit: stored and concealed anti-tank mines, other explosive devices and related equipment in preparation for an act of terrorism, and that OBAIDULLAH knew or intended that said material support and resources were to be used in preparation for and in carrying out a terrorist act.
