Lieutenant Colonel Jeremy S. Weber began his duties on the U.S. Court of Military Commission Review on March 18, 2014, after being informally sworn in as an Associate Appellate Judge. He has served as an Appellate Military Judge on the U.S. Air Force Court of Criminal Appeals since June 2013.
